# Important Information

Older Transmitters and Receivers (Before 1997) Are not compatible with this remote. There are no Security Code Switches inside the Door Operators, Transmitters, and Receivers.

#### WARNING

Moving Door Can cause serious injury or death.

- · Do Not install transmitter unless the door operator's safety reverse works as required by the door operator's manual.
- Wall control must be mounted in sight of door, at least 5 feet above the floor and clear of moving door parts.
- Keep people clear of opening while door is moving.
- Do Not allow children to play with the transmitter or door operator.

If safety reverse does not work properly:

- Close door then disconnect operator using the manual release handle.
- · Do Not use transmitter or door operator.
- Refer to Door and Door Operator Owner's Manuals before attempting any repairs.



Electrical Shock can cause serious injury or death.


- Power cord must be unplugged before attaching any
- · Be sure wire ends do not totuch each other or other terminals.

# To Program The Receiver

- Step 2-1 Locate the Learn Code Button and Radio Signal Indicator on the Power Head Receiver of your Door Operator.
- Step 2-2 Press and release the the Learn Code Button (Figure 1)
  - · The Radio Signal Indicator will blink approximately 2 times per minute.
- Press a Transmitter Button once within 30 seconds. **Step 2-3**

The Radio Signal Indicator stays lit - SOLID.



Press the same Transmitter Button Within 30 seconds. Step 2-4 · Radio Signal Indicator will go out.

NOTE: If a second Transmitter Code is not confirmed within 30 seconds or if a different Transmitter Code is sent, the Radio Signal Indicator will blink appproximately 4 times per second, then programming will stop. If programming stops, repeat Steps 2-2 through 2-4.

Repeat Steps 2-2 through Step 2-4 for each Transmitter, Step 2-5 Wireless Keypad of other access device to be learned.

Note: A maximum of 7 Transmitter, Wireless Keypad, and other access device Codes can be stored into Receiver Memory at one time. If a Transmitter becomes lost or if you want to delete a Transmitter, Wireless Keypad, or other access device, proceed to Step 4. ERASING ALL RECEIVER MEMORY.

## **Multi-Button Transmitters**

NOTE: Only ONE button of a Multi-Button Transmitter can be programmed into a single Receiver. The other buttons are to control other Door Operators.

NOTE: If you are replacing a lost or stolen Transmitter: (1) Erase ALL Transmitter Codes from the Receiver memory. (2) Reprogram the Receiver with the remaining Transmitter Codes.

# Erasing All Receiver Memory

Press and HOLD the Learn Code Button for 120 seconds. **Step 4-1** 


ALL Transmitter Codes are erased from Receiver Memory

Reprogram the Receiver with the remaining **Step 4-2** Transmitter Codes (Repeat Steps 2-2 through 2-4)

# Battery/ Clip Installation

#### Step 5-1 **Battery Replacement:**

- · Flip to the back of the transmitter and locate screw above key ring. (Figure 2)
- · Remove the screw from the back of the transmitter and pry apart.
- · Using the tip of a phillips Head screw driver (Flat head) push the old battery out, and replace it with the new CR032 Lithium battery. (Figure 3)
- · Reassemble the transmitter.
- To place transmitter in the clip, place transmitter at top of the cradle and slide down until snug.
- To remove from cradle, slide the transmitter up from the base of the cradle.



### Transmitter Operation

- · Point Transmitter at the garage door and press the button. The door
- · Press the Transmitter Button again and the door will stop.
- Press the Transmitter Button again and the door will move the other way: The door automatically stops at the end of the open or close cvcle.
